

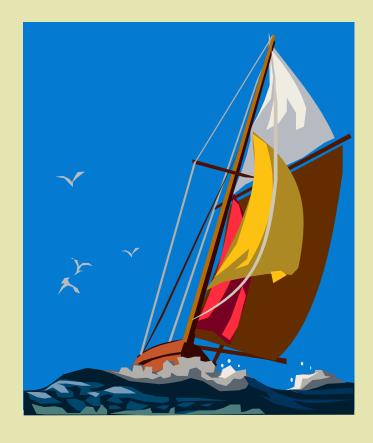

## Organizational Trends

- Manage EHS risks systematically
- Key Performance Indicators
- Be more efficient (do more with less)
- Looking for partners that can handle multiple locations and services

## Mergers and Acquisitions



- Number of deals has dropped dramatically
- Volume of Environmental Due Diligence work has declined to lowest in years
- Price pressure on projects
- Opportunistic buyers looking for bargains
- Don't expect business to pick up until late 2009

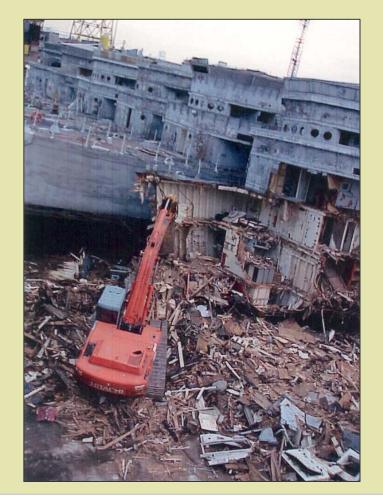




#### Contaminated Site Management



- Voluntary Site Cleanups may slow due to economy
- Developers delaying startups, withdrawing from sales
- Sites under Agreed Orders have to meet predetermined schedules

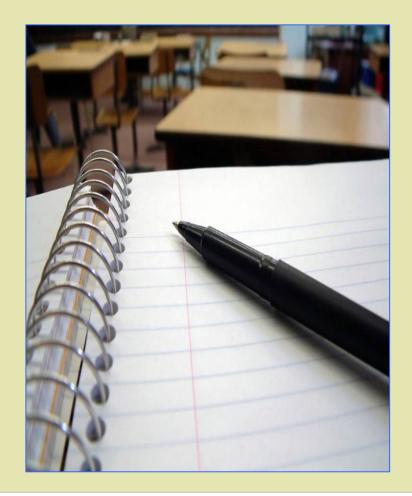




## Compliance Assessment

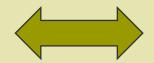


- Reduced budgets to minimum required for compliance
- Increase in calls for outsource compliance support as a bridge until EHS hiring can resume
- Compliance and audit work continues – price pressures
- Evaluation of management system certifications





# Impact Assessment and Planning



- Linear projects (electric transmission, pipelines) with requirements for environmental impact assessments are active
- Renewable energy planning and permitting active
- Closure and reclamation projects active
- Infrastructure and commercial/residential construction down

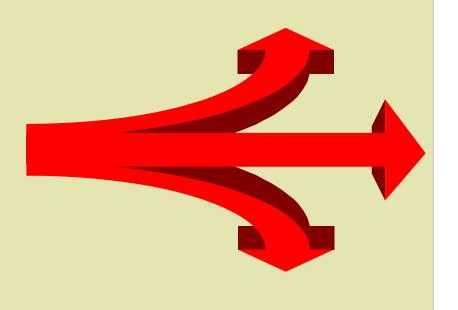




#### Strategic Advice



- Sustainability strategy programs being scaled back or delayed
- Carbon foot printing and reduction plans proceeding in anticipation of carbon tax
- Root cause analysis of EHS related issues occurring where these have been identified as a business risk





#### Sector Trends

- Financial reduced transactions
- Manufacturing cost reductions, outsourcing
- Oil and Gas exploration activity continues
- Electric Utilities building T&D and generation
- Government infrastructure spending



## Challenges to the Environmental Business

- Narrow service focus go wide, team
- Limited staff capabilities see above
- Poor cross servicing to clients listen to needs
- Ability to execute new delivery models learn fast
- Lack of standard tools/processes a must have
- Staff shortages less graduates last 5 years
